Here’s an interesting fact about automobiles. From 1910 to 1939 it took about 23 full years to actually replace the cheap horse and buggy because most people in the rural areas were too poor to be able to afford price of an automomobile and it wasn’t until after the Great Depression that the horse and buggy were completely ditched for good. I Granny was aksed about what she knew about the flapper girls during the 1920’s. Granny said, “what’s a flapper girl?” I told Granny, “the girls with fancy dresses and hats and they did a lot of dancing at parties and stuff.” Grany said, “Oh, those girls.” Granny told me that she had heard of them but in the country girls didn’t dress like that because it would very be hard to help with the farm animals dressed like that.

CHILI RECIPE:

- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2 medium yellow onions, medium dice
- 1 medium red bell pepper, medium dice
- 6 medium garlic cloves, finely chopped
- 1/4 cup chili powder
- 1 tablespoon ground cumin
- 2 pounds lean ground beef
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt, plus more as needed
- 1 (28-ounce) can diced tomatoes
- 1 (14-ounce) can tomato sauce
- 2 (15-ounce) cans kidney beans, drained and rinsed
- 1/4 cup coarsely chopped pickled jalapeños or green chiles, drained
